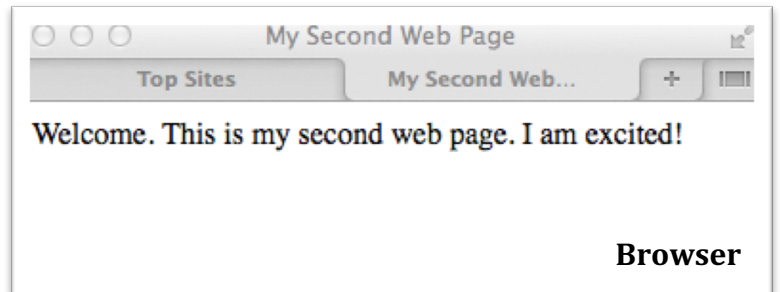
I recommend you make a duplicate of "My First Web Page" by doing a "Save As" and call the second page, "My Second Web Page." Then, begin making the Edits requested below.

1. Change the word "First" in the <Title> to "Second." Document below the change that occurred after you saved then viewed it in the browser (*remember to refresh*). (2pt.)
2. Change the word "first" in the <Body> to "second" and document below the change that occurred. (2pt.)

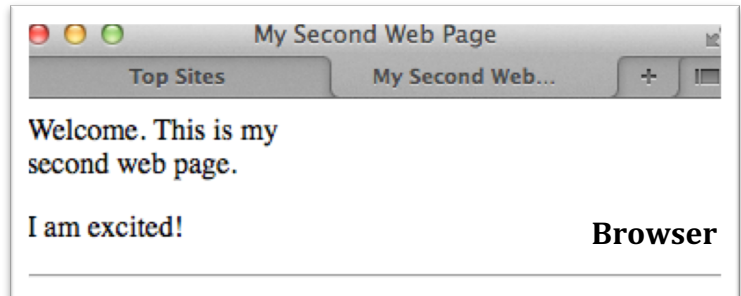


Paragraph Spacing <Tags>

<h1> <h1>to<h6>	Defines the headings at sizes 1-6. <i>Use Heading Tags on titles!</i> <i>Try the different heading sizes – Notice it automatically applies a line break.</i>	</h1> </h1>to</h6>
Standard Font Size ->	Defines standard font sizes. No Longer Supported- Now CSS! The text gets placed here.	
	Make the text italics.	
	Makes the text Bold.	
	Select a standard text color. Place the Tag next to the text.	
	Select a hexadecimal color.	
<Align=center> (or left or right)	Align the text (center, right or left). No Longer Supported- Now CSS!	(close not required)

7. Add a heading tag before and after "Welcome." Try several of the heading sizes 1-6. (2pt.)
8. Make the word "second" italics. (2pt.)
9. Make the word "I" Bold. (2pt.)
10. Change "Welcome" to the standard color red. (2pt.)
11. Change "excited" to the color blue. Here is the hexadecimal code: #083194 (2pt.)

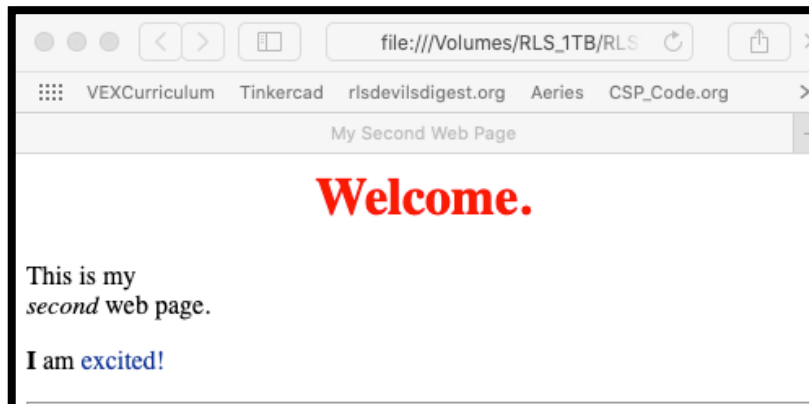
