Course Description:

Over the course of one semester, Video Tech students will develop the skills necessary to produce one scene from the original Star Wars movie. Course Content

By the end of the course, students will have a working knowledge of the following multimedia applications.

Applications:

- Final Cut Pro
- Animation

By the end of the course, students will have acquired the following skills.

Skills:

- Script writing & Storyboard creation
- Filming
- Lighting
- Editing videos
- Green Screen

Class Structure

Students will learn the applications by recreating models developed by the teacher. The students learn these skills by following video tutorials created by the teacher; this allows the student to move at their own speed. The students eventually use all these skills to create one scene from the original Star Wars movie. The students will write the script, film, direct and edit and their films.

Course Goal – “Develop Life Skills”
