<p><b>Submission #1: Script &amp; Storyboard Contract</b> Students will write a script detailing the conversations between actors &amp; actresses in their scene. They will draw the different views in each scene. The Team Leader needs to review the contract; when satisfied, they will sign it and send the student onto Mr. Harrington for his review and signature.</p>	50pts.
<p><b>Submission #2.0: Import Images &amp; Video Into New Final Cut Project Folder</b> Must have the Team Leader and then Mr. Harrington check to see that you have your Final Cut folder properly set up on your desktop. The F.C. Settings need to be staring at the folder. A new project should have been created and saved (into the folder). Your green screen video should have already been imported and visible as a video file in the project. Your images need to be imported and visible as files in the project as well. (Title the folder and project: "StarWars_YourName").</p>	60pts.
<p><b>Submission #2.1: Photoshop</b> At the same time that you present your Final Cut Folder, the Team Leader and Mr. Harrington will ask to view the original Photoshop files (.psd) that you created to edit the images that you intend to use in your video.</p>	20 pts.
<p><b>Submission #3: Your Finished Video</b> Must have the Team Leader and then Mr. Harrington review your final film. Points will be based upon: 1. Sound effects: at least one added to your video(10pts), 2. Length of video: Min. 30 seconds, Max. 1 minute(10pts), 3. Did you fulfill the contract? 40pts), 4. How is the quality of the video you created: Lighting? Framing? Background? Do your scenes actually look real? Has all the green screen been removed? How is the audio? Can you here the actors (40pts.)?</p>	100pts
<p><b>Submission #4: Export and Submit Your Scene</b> Export your scene as a Quicktime .mov file. Check it. Submit the file to Mr. Harrington.</p>	20 pts.
