**Course Content**

By the end of the course, students will have a working knowledge of the following multimedia applications.

**Applications:**

- Final Cut Express
- Live Type
- Soundtrack
- Flash
- Photoshop

By the end of the course, students will have acquired the following skills.

**Skills:**

- Script writing
- Storyboard creation
- Digital camcorder operation
- Filming techniques
- Lighting
- Editing and developing videos
- Audio integration
- Broadcast the Films
- Create DVDs.

**Class Structure**

During the first and second semesters, the students will learn a range of professional applications by recreating model & review pieces developed by the teacher. In the third semester, each student will create one scene of a greater class film. The students will write a script, film, direct, edit and submit their films by a contracted deadline. The class film will be review and if authorized, it will be shown at the Cameo Theatre.

Although I may be guiding the classes, most of the learning and support will come from the students around you I will develop a seating chart that will be composed of a well-balanced blend of students to maximize the amount of content you will master this year..

**Course Goal – "Life Skills"**

- Problem Solving - Find Solutions
- Hit Deadlines
- Achieve Beyond the Basic Requirements.

## Class Conduct

- The moment the bell rings be in your seat.
- If a student is being a distraction:  
First, they will be notified that they are distracting themselves and others from learning and will be given the opportunity to change their behavior.  
Second, if it persists, they will be asked to step outside for a few minutes to reflect on their actions and hopefully change.  
Third, if they continue, they will ask to go to the office where the counselor and principal can assist in changing the behavior.

### Also:

- Bathroom (Bladder Control) – School Rules state that you must go prior to class. If an emergency occurs during class, then we need the principal’s authorization.
- Water: If you are thirsty, get a drink on the way to class.
- Roaming the Room – The only students who should be out of their seats are those who are helping others. If you want to help someone, just ask.

- Other Class Assignments – Other class assignments are not to be done during class time.
