Our vineyards consist of 40 acres in the Oak Knoll District of the Napa Valley and produce chardonnay, cabernet sauvignon, pinot noir, merlot, and a small amount of cabernet franc and petit verdot. We farm an additional 70 acres for neighbors and family, which adds semillon and sauvignon blanc. Our grapes have been prized components for such celebrated wineries as Beringer, Bernardus, Chateau Montelena, Darioush, Grgich Hills, Merryvale, Robert Mondavi.



Winery History

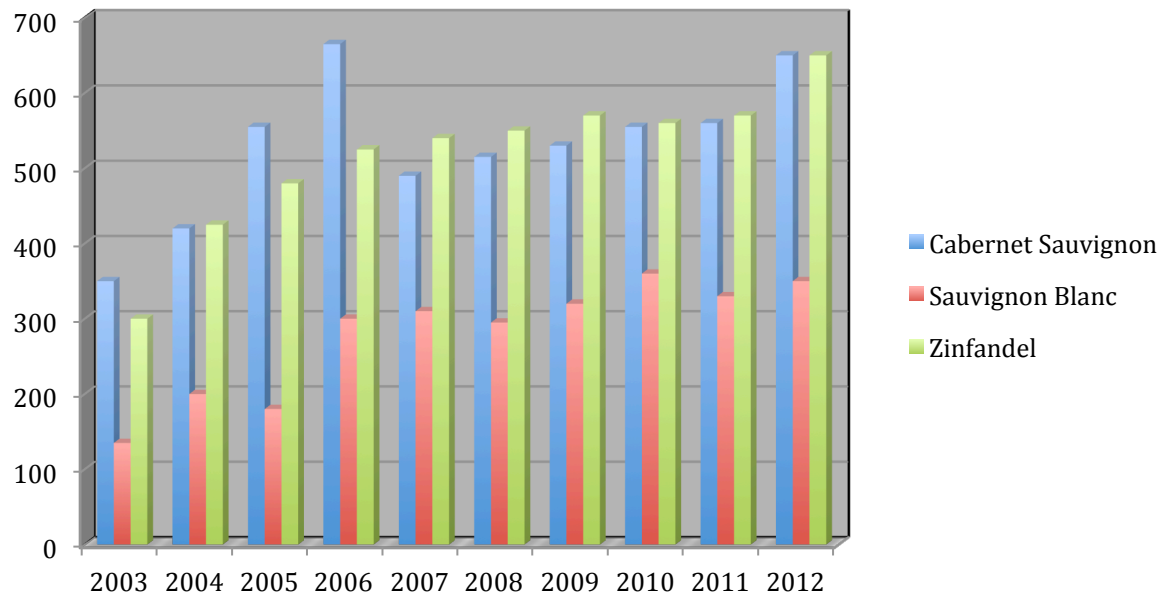
Muir-Hanna Vineyards is a family owned and operated vineyard and winery in California's famed Napa Valley. We are direct descendants of John Muir, one of America's most famous naturalists and conservationists. John Muir's in-laws, the Strentzels, began our family's California grape growing legacy in 1853 in Martinez, where four generations farmed until the middle of the 1930's. John Muir Hanna, one of John Muir's grandsons, grew up helping to farm the Martinez ranch, and in 1950, moved to Napa Valley with his family. Today, John's son Bill, Bill's wife Claudia, and their children, Michael and Kristin, operate the family business.

2013 Harvest & Sales Projections

We have contracts to sell most of our chardonnay and our pinot noir grapes to Mumm for champagne. The chardonnay crop looks like the yield will be average to slightly above. The set was good and the vines look quite healthy. The early rains provided ample soil moisture for vigorous vine growth and full bunches. In addition, this has been an extraordinarily mild growing season. We have had no prolonged hot spells and an unusually large number of days with below normal maximums. This bodes very well for an exceptional quality year.



2012 Sales Summary

2007 Bully Red

Over 1200 cases of Bully were sold in 2012, 700 alone in the fourth quarter. As usual, most of it sold here in California. Surprisingly, New York is a growth market for our wines. It appears that as many state economies are stagnating, New York's economy is expanding, and with it wine consumption.

Muir's Heritage Reserve Cuvee

Almost 600 cases of this Cuvee were sold in 2011. Several years ago, we started harvesting these grapes from the Oakville region instead of estate grapes. The results are in and the first vintage has been a tremendous success. The entire production sold out to wine club members. We intend to increase production by 20% next year.

Muir's Legacy Merlot

Our Merlot sales increased in the 4th quarter bringing the year total to 503 cases. Overall, Merlot is showing lackluster growth.
